▶ **History & Overview**

Buda, originally named De Pre, saw a burst of growth after the International and Greater Northern Railroad expanded from Austin to San Antonio. When a rail stop was placed in Buda, more and more business came to the area. Located along Interstate Highway 35, just 20 minutes from Austin, Buda is in Hays County and is considered one of the fastest growing cities in the region.



▶ **Education**

Hays ISD serves K-12 academic programs and offers career and technical education as well as science, technology, engineering, arts, and mathematics based educational programs.



▶ **Major Business Industries**

Buda has seen extensive expansion and overall growth in recent years. The city has a diverse range of business opportunities with health care and social assistance, retail trade, education, construction and professional, and technical and scientific businesses representing the major industries. Some of the largest employers include Baylor Scott & White, Capital City Steel, Centex Materials and Deep Eddy Vodka.



▶ **Arts & Culture**

Buda is home to several historic attractions, including the historic Downtown District, 1898 Building, Buda Mill & Grain Co. and the historic McElroy-Severn Stagecoach House and Visitor Center. Visitors and residents make it a priority to visit the 185,000 square foot Cabela's with showrooms, aquariums, archery range and restaurant.

▶ Parks & Outdoors

Named the “Outdoor Capital of Texas”, Buda offers wide open green spaces for all to enjoy. The town has numerous parklands and recreational areas for residents to hike, bike and explore. Some of the most notable include Stagecoach Park, Bradfield Village Park, Buda City Park and Jackson Tyler Norris Memorial Skate Park.



▶ Festivals

Buda hosts a variety of festivals throughout the year. Residents and visitors all enjoy exploring shops and listening to music at First Saturday. They also enjoy the downtown Buda Farmer’s Market and Buda Lions County Fair and Weiner Dog Races. The community hosts an annual Easter Egg Hunt, a Red, White n’ Buda Independence Day Celebration, Fajita Fiesta and Cocoa Jingle.



▶ Neighborhoods

Buda’s motto is Breathe Easy Here. The beautiful landscapes and affordable housing options offer something for a multitude of residents. A few of the neighborhoods include Bradfield Village, Brushy Creek, Cimarron Park, Elliott Ranch, Hays Country Oaks, Oak Forest, Stonefield, Stone Ridge, The Estates Of Dodgen Ranch, The Meadows at Buda, Triple R Ranchettes, Village At Buda, Whispering Hollow and White Oak Preserve.
