▶ **History & Overview**

Cedar Park was founded by George and Harriet Cluck and was previously named Running Brushy and Brueggeroff. The Cluck's son renamed the city, Cedar Park, after the park like setting of the family home. Cedar Park is located in Williamson County, approximately 20 minutes north of Austin, and is one of the largest cities in the Austin Round Rock MSA.



▶ **Education**

Served by Leander ISD, the district is a fast growign district serving families in Austin, Cedar Park, and Leander. Cedar Park residents also enjoy higher education opportunities like the Austin Community College Cypress Creek Campus and nearby learning institutions, such as The University of Texas at Austin, Concordia University, Southwestern University Georgetown, Huston-Tillotson University, St. Edward's University, Texas A&M Health Sciences Center and Texas State University Round Rock Campus.



▶ **Major Business Industries**

Cedar Park hosts a diverse mix of businesses, including regional and national headquarters, defense and aerospace, healthcare and biotechnology, software development, clean technology and advanced manufacturing. Several major employers include Cedar Park Regional Medical Center, CoreSlab Structures, National Oilwell Varco, ETS-Lindgren and BHI.



▶ **Arts & Culture**

Cedar Park has several attractive entertainment options for residents. Whether it's visiting the Cedar Park Sculpture Garden, attending a concert at the HEB Center, touring the Veterans Memorial Park or taking in a Texas Stars Hockey or Austin Spurs Basketball game, residents can enjoy all that Cedar Park has to offer.

▶ **Wineries, Breweries, & Pubs**

▶ **Parks & Outdoors**

Over 40 parks, 1000 acres of parkland and 250 acres of cave preserves, Cedar Park is an outdoor oasis. Some of the most popular outdoor spaces include Milburn Park, Brushy Creek Lake Park, Brushy Creek Sports Park, Veterans Park, Nelson Ranch Park, Cedar Park, Bark Park and Twin Creeks Country Club.
