

History & Overview

Located in Williamson County, Hutto is less than 30 miles from downtown Austin and is known for its famous hippos. Local legend has it that the famous Hutto Hippo mascot made its mark after a circus train stopped in Hutto and the hippopotamus escaped. Hutto is now known as the official "Hippo Capital of Texas". The town was established after the International and Great Northern Railroad purchased the land from James Emory Hutto and built a station. Since that time, Hutto has exploded with population growth and has been recognized as an economically vibrant community.



Education

Hutto has K-12 education as well as a wide range of advanced and college level courses. Higher education opportunities are just around the corner with Texas State University campus in Round Rock, Southwestern University in Georgetown and The University of Texas in Austin. Hutto now has the East Williamson County Higher Education Center which includes Temple College, Texas State Technical College and Texas A&M-Central Texas.



Major Business Industries

Being located near Round Rock's high-tech manufacturing and assembly center, Hutto has become recognized among the Top 100 Places in major markets to locate a business. Some of the major industries include health care and social assistance, manufacturing, retail trade, public administration and education. A few of the top employers are Paradigm Metals, Apple, Dell, IBM and Seton Healthcare Family.



Arts & Culture

Known for its hippos, Hutto has over 3,000 concrete hippos scattered throughout the town. A hometown favorite is the welcome mural that greets visitors with "The Hutto Postcard". For residents looking for a cultural experience, the historic downtown area has 1890's Victorian Italianate style buildings. Residents can visit the Williamson Museum or see a play at the Sam Bass Theatre in Round Rock or Georgetown Palace Theatre.
