▶ History & Overview

The second largest city in Hays County, Kyle was founded in 1880 by settlers from Blanco and Mountain City communities. Kyle is eight miles north of San Marcos, twenty miles south of Austin and 60 miles north of San Antonio. The convenient location to these major cities makes Kyle a popular place to live. In addition to a booming economy, the city of Kyle has the bragging rights to being the place where fajita tacos started.



▶ Education

Hays CISD serves K-12 grades and is one of the fastest growing school districts in the state. Within a short distance, there are several colleges and universities, including The University of Texas at Austin, Texas State University and Trinity.



▶ Major Business Industries

The city of Kyle is experiencing a surge in economic growth. Several new companies have joined the business industry, including HPI, Smile Direct Club, Majestic Realty, AlSCO and ENF. A few of the major employers represented are Hays CISD, Seton Medical Center Hays, HEB Plus, Legend Oaks Healthcare & Rehabilitation and Lowes.



▶ Arts & Culture

In addition to the various outdoor parks and amenities, Kyle offers its residents several cultural experiences. Residents can enjoy visiting the Katherine Anne Porter House, Claiborne Kyle Log House, Kyle Auction Oak, Historic Kyle City Hall, and The Kyle Railroad Depot and Heritage Center.

▶ Parks & Outdoors

There is no shortage of things to do in Kyle. From fishing to golfing to tubing, the city invites its residents outdoors. Popular outdoor places include Lake Kyle, Steeplechase Park, City Square Park, Plum Creek Golf Course and the Disc Golf Course.



▶ Festivals

Home to several annual community celebrations, Kyle hosts the Kyle Pie in the Sky, Kyle Market Days, Santa on the Square and Art the Halls.
