



History & Overview

Located 15 miles west of Georgetown and 33 miles northwest of Austin, the town of Liberty Hill began in the 1840's with a few settlers. William Oliver Spencer was named postmaster after a post office was created in 1853, three miles west of Liberty Hill's current location. Spencer later suggested that the town be named Liberty Hill. Downtown Liberty Hill still has many of its original buildings, a few of them which have been restored.



Education

Liberty Hill Independent School District (LHISD) is a 5A school district serving students K-12. Impressive universities, colleges, junior colleges, art and culinary and medical/dental facilities are in relatively close proximity to Liberty Hill. They include Liberty Hill Dental Assisting School, The University of Texas at Austin, Central Texas College, St. Edward's University, Austin Community College, University of Mary Hardin-Baylor, Southwestern University, The Art Institute of Austin and Le Cordon Bleu Culinary Institute of Austin.



Major Business Industries

Liberty Hill has become one of the fastest growing communities in the Austin Metro area. With close proximity to the Permian Basin, Houston and Dallas, Liberty Hill is situated in a prime location for oil & gas opportunities. Additionally, just a few short miles to Austin, the high-tech hub of Texas, Liberty Hill is positioned for creative technology, clean technology, computer software, architecture and manufacturing businesses.

Looking for some interesting cultural experiences? Be sure to visit these local treasures: Liberty Hill Sculpture Park located at Lions Foundation Park, The Sculpture Garden which is home to 25 larger-than-life sculptures and the City Park Cinema for summer movies in the park.
