



MARBLE FALLS CITY GUIDE



▶ History & Overview

Founded in 1887 by AR Johnson, Marble Falls is a gem of a place! If you follow the Colorado River into the heart of the Texas Hill Country, you'll find Marble Falls. The falls for which the town was named were used as a landmark by travelers and were referred to as the "Great Falls" or the "Marble Falls". When AR Johnson saw the falls, he wanted to create a city; and when the Austin and Northern Railroads built extensions to Marble Falls, the town boomed with tourists seeking recreation and leisure. The dams that created Lake Marble Falls came to be in 1951. Marble Falls is located 58 miles northwest of downtown Austin.



▶ Education

Marble Falls ISD is classified as a 5-A district and has a growing enrollment exceeding 4,000 students. The District delivers an array of exciting and challenging opportunities. The city has higher learning campus opportunities at Texas Tech University Hill Country and Central Texas College.



▶ Major Business Industries

Marble Falls is the hub for shopping, dining and entertainment for all of Burnet County. The Marble Falls Business & Technology Park is fully fiber connected offering internet speeds of more than 1,000 MBS. Marble Falls ISD, Horseshoe Bay Resort, Baylor Scott & White, H.E.B. are all major employers in Marble Falls.



▶ Arts & Culture

In downtown Marble Falls, you can see art in a gallery, on the sidewalk, along the lake or throughout the shops. The town is rich with culture and residents have the opportunity to enjoy several cultural experiences, including Choccolatte's & Third St. Treasures, Marta Stafford Fine Art Gallery, Sculptures on Main, Indian River, Highland Arts Guild and Birdie's Market



▶ Dining

Marble Falls is brimming with dining options. The town offers several options for breakfast, lunch and dinner. Some of the favorites are the famous Blue Bonnet Café (pie happy hour), Darci's Deli, River City Grille, Ginger & Spice, Simply Pho House, Oli's Kitchen, Wingman Brother's Smokehouse, Darci's Deli and Doc's Fish Camp & Grill.

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▶ **Wineries, Breweries, & Pubs**

The Texas Hill Country is home to some of the best breweries and wineries, including Bear King Brewing Co., Double Horn Brewing Company, Real Ale Brewing Company and Pecan Street Brewery. The wine trail is a long one that will not disappoint. Residents can tour and enjoy wine at Torr Na Lochs Vineyard & Winery, Perissos Vineyard & Winery, Fiesta Winery, The Vineyard B&B at Lost Creek Ranch, Spicewood Vineyards, Wedding Oak Winery, El Gaucho Winery, Westcave Cellars Winery & Brewery, McReynolds Winery and Stone House Vineyard.



▶ **Parks & Outdoors**

Marble Falls has several water and land activities, such as boating, hiking, fishing, birding, paddling, kayaking, canoeing and camping. Some of the amazing, scenic outdoor places that offer cascading rock cliffs and rolling hills are Inks Lake State Park, Hidden Falls Adventure Park, Balcones Canyonlands National Wildlife Refuge, Longhorn Cavern State Park, Shaffer Bend, Muleshoe Bend, Westcave Outdoor Discovery Center, Sweet Berry Farm and Pedernales River Nature Park. Marble Falls is home to some of the best championship golf courses around, and residents can play at several courses, including Blue Lake Golf Club, Hidden Falls Golf Course at Meadowlakes, The Legends Golf Course and Delaware Springs Golf Course.



▶ **Festivals**

Residents of Marble Falls enjoy year-round festivals including Walkway of Lights with Winter Ice Skating, Paint the Town, Main Street Market Day, Mayfest and Howdy Roo Food Festival.



▶ **Neighborhoods**

This lake town is perfect for all adventures from land, lake or sky. The surrounding state parks, natural wonders and local wineries make Marble Falls a top destination for visitors and those looking to make a permanent home. Marble Falls hosts a small town feel with easy access to city living. Some of the most popular neighborhoods include Claremont, Cottonwood Shores, Marble Fall South, Meadowlakes, Sycamore Falls, Tobeyville, Uplands and Waterfronts.
