

History & Overview

San Marcos is located on the IH-35 corridor, just 30 miles south of Austin and 40 miles north of San Antonio. The city was the site of several Spanish attempts at colonization before being established as an agricultural and ranching center. The city was chartered in 1877 and since that time has continued to experience economic prosperity.



Education

San Marcos Consolidated ISD serves students in Hays County, Caldwell and Guadalupe counties. The district offers career and technical education that includes 13 career pathways and 20 programs of study. Higher education opportunities exist at Texas State and Austin Community College.



Major Business Industries

San Marcos is ranked among the fastest growing cities in the U.S. Additionally, the Greater San Marcos Region is one of the fastest growing areas in the country. The major business sectors include accommodation and food, retail trade and education.



Arts & Culture

The city is full of history and cultural experiences. Residents can enjoy art and culture everywhere they go in San Marcos, including places like Hispano de San Marcos, San Marcos Art Center, Commemorative Air Force Exhibit, Calaboose African American History Museum, Hays County Veterans Memorial and LBJ MLK Crossroads Memorial.
