

History & Overview

Wimberly Initially started as a trading post settlement along Cypress Creek and later became known as Winters' Mill after William Winters, who fought in the Battle of San Jacinto built a gristmill on Cypress Creek. The name of the settlement changed several times because of different ownership of the mill. In 1880, the town became known as Wimberley. Located approximately 45 miles southwest of Austin, the community is a special place in the Texas Hill Country.
